Leslie Genovese is currently the Senior Manager, Major Partners and Corporate Relationships for the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank, Feeding America's 2012 Food Bank of the Year. The Foodbank was founded in 1982 and serves 8



counties, distributing emergency food to more than 500 member agencies who serve 263,200 clients each year. In 2016, the Foodbank distributed more than 28.8 million pounds of food throughout its network.

During her 13 year tenure at the Foodbank, fundraising revenue increased by more than 400% to \$5.8 million annually. Leslie manages all fundraising initiatives for current and prospective corporate partners in the Foodbank service area raising millions of dollars and thousands of pounds of food for those in need each year.

A native of Northeast Ohio, Leslie Genovese is a graduate of Northwest High School and earned a BS in Health Administration from Ohio University Additionally, Leslie is a graduate of the Inaugural Leadership Stark County Spotlight Young Professionals program and a graduate of Leadership Stark County Signature Program Class 28. The success of this program will rely on volunteers to serve as mentors. Mentoring can take place online, by phone, or in person at Akron chapter events or other locations.

The CMA Designation The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) is the advanced professional certification specifically designated to measure the accounting and financial management skills that drive business performance. Achieving the CMA credential demonstrates your mastery of financial planning, analysis, control, and decision support, as well as professional ethics.

The CMA credential is:

Focused - On the critical skills you use in business Respected - Leading employers seek to hire and promote CMAs Valued - CMAs on average, earn higher compensation than noncertified professionals Convenient - CMA exams are offered electronically in hundreds of locations worldwide.

The CMA Mentoring Program - The accreditation process leading to the CMA designation can be a rigorous experience requiring great energy and effort. The CMA candidate will have questions regarding exam content, study materials, test taking strategies, and much more. Without somebody to guide and mentor them, the candidate may become discouraged and abandon the certification program. However, through the Akron IMA CMA Mentoring Program, candidates will be able to seek and obtain the support and guidance of fellow chapter members who have earned their CMA designation.

Mentees and mentors will be matched based on the needs of the mentee and the availability of the mentors. The ideal mentor for this CMA focused program would be an individual who has obtained the CMA certification and / or who has recently passed one or both parts of the newer two part CMA exam structure. All individuals who are currently enrolled in the CMA program and studying for the CMA exam are encouraged to enroll as a mentee. In addition, individuals who are undecided about obtaining the CMA certification and would like additional information or guidance are encouraged to enroll.
